Transportation challenges: Ever since the college has shifted to the new campus, students find it difficult to reach the college.

### What we can do:

Professional Development: The college can enhance its curriculum by incorporating more professional development opportunities such as webinars on career placements.

Curriculum Enhancement: There is an opportunity to introduce mandatory courses like Art History to provide students with a broader understanding of their field.

Workshops and Guest Lectures: Organizing regular workshops and inviting industry professionals can provide students with valuable insights and networking opportunities.

Alumni Engagement: Engaging alumni in mentoring current students or participating in workshops can strengthen community ties and provide practical insights.

## What can be the Challenges

# **Action Plan**

To address the feedback received from stakeholders and leverage the findings from the analysis, the following actions are recommended:

Upgrade Facilities: Invest in updating computer labs and software to ensure students have access to the latest technology relevant to their studies.

Revise Curriculum: Incorporate Art History as a mandatory subject in Applied Arts programs and reassess other subjects to align them with contemporary practices in the art world as part of NEP. Demand teachers for Art History. Demand more faculty members for all departments.

Enhance Professional Development: Organize webinars focusing on career opportunities in art and design, along with regular workshops led by industry professionals.

Improve Classroom Environment: Evaluate classroom sizes and consider restructuring class schedules to minimize disturbances from other classes.

Ensure more transportation facility for students so that they may commute easily.

Enhance Alumni Involvement: Create a platform for alumni to engage with current students through mentorship programs or guest lectures, fostering a sense of community and shared experience.

Encourage Critical Feedback: Implement a system for regular critique sessions where students can receive constructive feedback on their work from faculty and peers.
